GOVERNOR'S AWARD QUALITY AND PRODUCTIVITY

The Governor's Award for Quality and Productivity (GAQP) is a team award that recognizes service excellence, efficiency/process improvement, and innovation in Missouri State Government. All winning projects must satisfy established requirements of effectiveness, responsiveness, and efficiency, achieving a quality that positions the project as a model of excellence in state government on a national level.

GAQP History

The GAQP was originally established in 1988. At that time, nominations for a completed project could be submitted and were then reviewed by a selection committee based on a set of criteria. Award winners were identified, and sometimes, multiple winners were recognized in one criteria area. Over the years, improvements have continued and in 2001, the use of specific award categories was introduced.

In 2010, the Pinnacle Award was implemented. This award is only recommended by the selection committee if, in their opinion, the nomination encompasses multiple award categories in a manner that exemplifies the spirit of the Governor's Award or exceeds all other nominations.

Today, the GAQP recognizes winning teams in three categories: Customer Service, Efficiency/Process Improvement, and Innovation. These winning teams serve as a model of efficiency, quality, and effectiveness for other Missouri State Government teams to follow.

When shots rang out and gunshot victims cried for help at the Kansas City Chiefs Super Bowl celebration on February 14, 2024, the State Emergency Management Agency's Missouri Disaster Medical Assistance Team (MO DMAT-1) was pre-positioned to respond thanks to in-depth planning and strong local partnerships. At the request of the Kansas City Fire Department, MO DMAT-1 had set up mobile medical units both inside and outside Union Station as part of the advance operational plan for the event. When violence erupted, DMAT team members worked jointly with KCFD, law enforcement and local medical personnel to quickly retrieve victims from the crowd and get them to the nearest medical tent where they were triaged, treated and stabilized for transport to the nearest hospital.

The team's lifesaving work that day was one of many successful outcomes because of MO DMAT-1's increased capacity and capabilities to respond to myriad medical and health care needs on an expedited basis. Since 2020, particularly because of the COVID-19 pandemic response, MO DMAT-1 has transformed into a rapidly deployable, fully equipped unit capable of providing highly specialized medical personnel for a multitude of mission assignments. MO DMAT-1 response teams have been configured to provide relief for overwhelmed hospitals and nursing homes, monoclonal infusion clinics, medical testing and vaccination assignments as well as first aid and higher levels of care at major public events – from Super Bowl parades to large concerts.

Survey Says, Feedback is a Gift

The Missouri Department of Revenue's audit team is tasked with conducting compliance audits on businesses. Through a survey initiative to seek feedback referred to as the "Voice of the Customer" the audit team received valuable insight indicating the need to streamline billing notice issuance post-audit.

The term "audit" often induces stress, which contradicts the department's commitment to customer service. The department's auditors work hard to gain client trust and assist them in statutory compliance. However, once the audit was closed, the feedback we received noted customers faced confusion and stress from receiving multiple costly certified letters containing lengthy assessment notices. Previously, the department sent separate notices for each period with a liability. Since audits review a 3-year period, it could result in 36 periods—subsequently resulting in a flood of costly assessments. In 2021, 13,590 certified letters were sent for just 923 audits completed. Additionally, many customers believed they needed to pay multiple payments with added "convenience fees" for each submission.

The main goals of this initiative were to reduce customer frustration and financial burden to the department, while streamlining the assessment notification process and improve the customer experience without additional technology costs.

The One Team One Bill initiative transferred final billing responsibilities to the client-facing auditor allowing for personalized assessment delivery. This redesigned process included creating a consolidated billing notice, instituting quality checkpoints, conducting customer testing, revamping documentation, and educating staff on the new process. A phased rollout was completed by December 1, 2022.

In 2023, by utilizing this new consolidated billing method, the team reduced total costs, for customers and the department, from a projected \$328,699 to \$174,544, achieving a first-year savings of over \$154,000. These ongoing savings will increase as material and postage costs continue to rise. Feedback indicates customers are less frustrated not having multiple billing notices at the close of an audit. The initiative has proven successful, with future savings opportunities on the horizon.

The Welfare Investigative Unit (WIU) plays a vital role in addressing federal benefit fraud, particularly in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP). Initially relying on tips from the public and the Family Support Division, the WIU recognized the need for advanced data analytics due to increasingly sophisticated fraudulent activity.

To enhance its capabilities, the WIU launched a project to create an application that would search multiple databases for indicators of fraud and identity theft related to SNAP benefits. A significant \$415,025 grant from USDA's Food and Nutrition Services facilitated a partnership with the Information Technology Services Division (ITSD), resulting in the timely development of the Fraud Finder Data Analytic Application.

By December 2023, the program had initiated 1,065 investigations, uncovering over \$1.4 million in fraudulent claims and saving

Missouri more than \$2 million. This effort disqualified 623 SNAP beneficiaries and led to 37 criminal prosecutions.

The Fraud Finder application, designed for analyzing diverse data sources, effectively identified potential fraudsters, using tools such as Visual Studio and the Global Information Tracker for project management. Its implementation tripled investigation numbers and significantly improved WIU's standing, prompting increased training requests from neighboring states and greater opportunities for conference presentations.

Fraud Finder comprises five modules that collectively produce actionable fraud reports and has proven to be a success, backed by a dedicated team committed to mitigating identity theft and preserving the integrity of public assistance programs.
